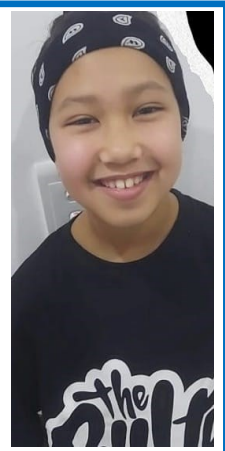
Learners who receive 3 Principal Award Certificates will receive a surprise from the Principal at the weekly assembly. Congratulations to the following learners:

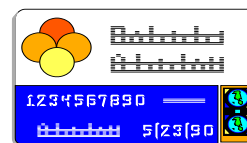
